

The Book of James

September is the month of James, by that I mean we will work our way through the Book of James in our Sunday morning lectionary (see schedule below). Martin Luther wasn't the biggest fan of the Book of James, calling it "The Epistle of Straw."

James includes a lot of Law language, and for someone who stressed grace through faith in Jesus as an important theological ideal, Luther struggled with holding this book on equal ground with many of the other New Testament writings. Yet, it is still in our 3-year lectionary cycle, and it is seen as an important book of the Bible that can help us live a good, faithful, godly life.

So, this month, pay close attention to the readings from James and consider to yourself, "How does this apply to my life today and my faith in Jesus as Lord and Savior?" I look forward to diving into this book with you over the next few weeks.



Children and youth are the hope and future of the St. John community. Through our youth groups and activities, we nurture our children in an environment of love and faith, helping them grow into these values throughout their lives.

****Sunday School**** is designed to show kids that church is a fun, safe place where they are loved by God. It's an educational time to study God's Word, hear both Law and Gospel, and deepen their understanding of faith in Jesus through stories and hands-on activities.

****Confirmation****, also known as Affirmation of Baptism, is a time for young people to declare their commitment to the promises made on their behalf during baptism. The years spent in confirmation classes are dedicated to exploring faith, integrating it into everyday life, and understanding the church. These classes help students prepare to affirm their baptismal faith, trusting that God will guide them throughout their lives. During confirmation, we delve into the core beliefs of Christianity, such as The Trinity, the Church, sin and salvation. We also discuss the impact of our actions toward God and others, and study The Ten Commandments, The Apostle's Creed, The Lord's Prayer, and The Sacraments as presented in Luther's Small Catechism.

****Luther League**** is our high school youth group for students in 9th to 12th grade. It offers a space for fellowship, Christian education, and service, where high school youth can safely discuss their faith questions. The group meets regularly throughout the year, engaging in mission projects, planning activities and outings, and sharing devotions and prayers.

****Christian Youth United (CYU)**^{**} is a collaborative Youth Group formed by area churches to provide a safe space for our community youth to grow in their walk with God. We all face challenges to our faith, whether from others or difficult circumstances. That's why it's crucial to have a foundational knowledge of Christianity and a willing heart to obey God. In CYU, we learn what it means to live out God's call to share our lives and faith with friends, colleagues, and neighbors.


Back to school is a great time to start picking up things to fill your shoeboxes for our annual Operation Christmas Child shoebox drive later on this year.

Rostered ministers and lay members are invited to join the synod's new Substance Abuse Network, which will encourage and promote ways that the synod, rostered ministers, lay leaders and congregations can bring hope and healing to those affected by substance abuse.

Drug addiction, alcoholism, codependency, and behavioral addictions are among the most prevalent, complex and destructive illnesses in human society. It has long been recognized that addiction contains a spiritual dimension that must be inte-grated into treatment more than other disorders.

The Substance Abuse Network, which was formed in response to a resolution adopted at the 2022 Northeastern Iowa Synod Assembly, will advise how leaders and congregations can collaborate with organizations like Alcoholics Anonymous, Narcotics Anonymous, Al-Anon, the Center of Addiction and Faith, and Fellowship of Recovering Lutheran Clergy, as well as state and local authorities.
